

CITY OF HIGHLAND HEIGHTS, KENTUCKY

ORDINANCE NO. 10-2001

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING
THE PAYMENT OF WAGE DIFFERENTIAL
TO CITY EMPLOYEES WHO ARE CALLED
INTO ACTIVE DUTY WITH THE UNITED
STATES MILITARY.

WHEREAS, the events of September 11, 2001 have required governments both local and national to take extraordinary measures, and;

WHEREAS, the City of Highland Heights wants to protect its citizens and employees from unnecessary hardship in the event city employees are called into active duty with the United States Military.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF HIGHLAND HEIGHTS, KENTUCKY
AS FOLLOWS:

Section I

That any Highland Heights employee that is called into active military service shall be paid the difference between his active military pay and his wage while employed with the City of Highland Heights in the event his active military pay is lower than his Highland Heights wage.

Section II

This payment shall continue for a period of 24 months while the employee is serving in an active US military service.

Section III


That this Ordinance shall be signed by the Mayor, attested by the City Clerk/Treasurer, recorded and published. Same shall be in effect at the earliest time provided by law.
