

**CITY OF HIGHLAND HEIGHTS

Public Hearing Minutes  
May 7, 2019**

On May 7, 2019 Mayor Meyers opens the Public Hearing at 6:30 p.m.

**Mayor Meyers announces the purpose of the Public Hearing is to discuss the proposed use of Municipal Aid Road Funds for Fiscal Year 2019-2020.**

**Notification Process:**

Notification of the public hearing was published in the Campbell County Recorder on April 18, 2019. Notice was posted on the front page of the website and the front door of the City Building.

**Mayor's Presentation:**

The purpose of the Public Hearing is to take testimony about the condition of the streets; decisions are not made. Councilmembers Ball and Chinn will give council a report about what they found when looking at the streets. We will receive approximately \$140,000 from the State, to be used strictly for roads – paving, drainage, salt, etc. The city will continue its aggressive program on our streets, which started about 20 years ago. Residents used to be assessed a charge per linear foot of street in front of their house. Now, the city provides street repair and replacement for our residents.

**Comments from Council Members:**

Member Chinn reported the following:

- Sunset Avenue from 214-244 is very rough and has pot holes.
- Lincoln by the new duplexes is in terrible shape.
- Rose Avenue is in very rough shape and needs to be considered.
- Louisville Avenue at the top of the street has a rough surface. The last house before the driveway has deep pot holes.
- Monroe around 2574 has pot holes.
- Maple has many pot holes.
- Jillian plan is to do panel replacements and keep the street concrete. Questions raised about the repairs Duke Energy is making repairs now that the gas line work seems finished. Residents upset with the quality of the work. City staff explained that what has been done is temporary. Once Duke is finished with all their work in Highland Heights, a sub-contractor will bring in a restoration team to replace concrete and restore grassy areas.
- Knollwood & Hilltop – Panel replacement at the intersection. This will be completed once school is out and before it starts up again so that school buses can make that corner.

- Bon Jan and Towanda – Concern about flooding in back yard and into basement. Much of the water comes from the highway but this is private property. The easement is between property owners and we have no authority to go on the property. The property owners are responsible.
- The access roads behind Stockyard Bank and from BP to Frisch's are in terrible shape. This is private property. Dave Whitacre has sent a letter a month ago to the owners to fix the access roads.




