

**CITY OF HIGHLAND HEIGHTS
MUNICIPAL AID ROAD FUND
PUBLIC HEARING MINUTES
MAY 3, 2016**

On Tuesday, May 3, 2016 Mayor Meyers called the Municipal Aid Road Fund Public Hearing to order at 176 Johns Hill Road at 7:00 p.m.

PRESENT: Mayor Gregory Meyers, Council Members: Deborah Ball, Gary Chinn, Jeanne Pettit, Dave Ramler, Scott Reincke and Scott Sedmak.

Also present: City Attorney Steve Franzen, ~~City Engineer/Zoning Administrator Dave Whitacre~~, Public Works Supervisor Steve Lehman, Police Chief Bill Birkenhauer and City Clerk Treasurer/Recording Secretary Jean Rauf.

Mayor Meyers announced the purpose of the Public Hearing is to receive comments and discuss the proposed use of Municipal Air Road Funds for Fiscal Year 2016-2017.

NOTIFICATION PROCESS: Mrs. Rauf announced that Notice of the MARF Public Hearing meeting was published in the Campbell County Recorder on April 21, 2016. Notice was posted on the front door of the City Building.

MAYORS PRESENTATION: Mayor Meyers announced the City has \$150,000.00 to spend on repairs for the roads. Mayor Meyers turned it over to the Infrastructure Committee for comments.

COMMENTS FROM COUNCIL: Member Chinn gave a report of streets that need road repairs. He stated that he and Member Ramler checked the streets. They gave a brief informational report on the following streets:

- #1. Katherine Court needs panels replaced it is in bad shape.
- #2. Sunset to North Miller where the new surface started, it is in rough condition.
- #3. Louisville, Hale and Thompson need work.
- #4. The intersection of Jillian and Hilltop are rough.
- #5. Ridge Hill needs small repairs and Tesseneer Drive needs to be checked.

Member Chinn agreed with the Mayor that the streets are in good shape but there are some streets that need attention.

Mayor Meyers reported he will see that the City Engineer/Zoning Administrator Dave Whitacre receives the list of streets recommended for repairs at the Council Meeting for review.
